May your teenagers know that this is a safe place.

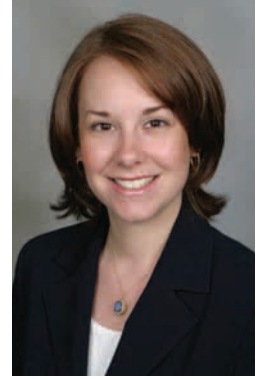
May you always know this congregation, first and foremost, as a k'hilah k'doshah – a sacred community.

# Prime Timers Report

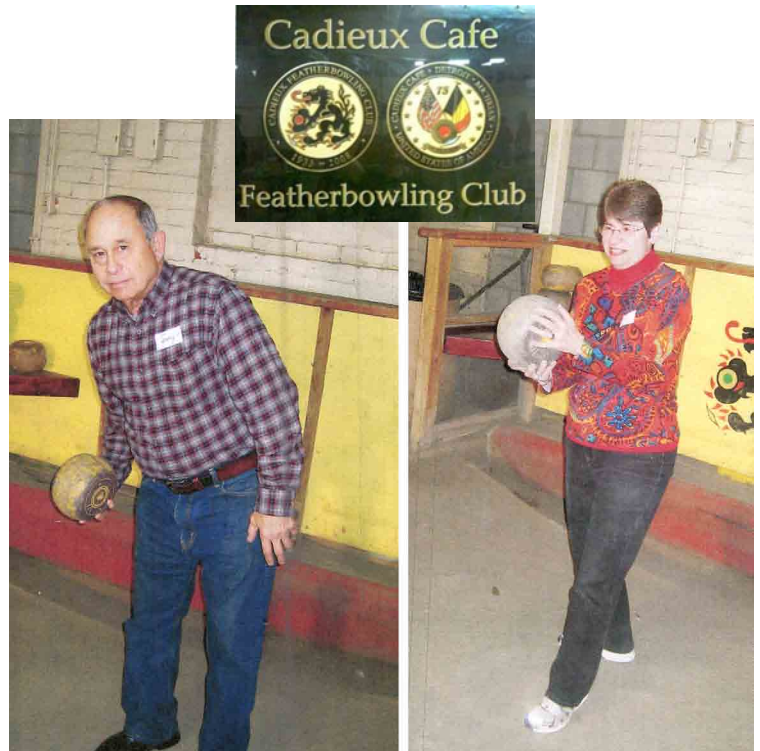

It's been a very exciting academic year at Temple Emanu-El, with more highlights than we can mention. In September TEMTY (teen youth group) went to Paintball. In October we held our 6th and 7th grade retreat at Tamarack for the first time. The Jewish Ensemble Theatre brought us two plays on bullying in November, in December we again celebrated our students' talents with the M.A.C.A.B.E.E. Awards (Music and Culture Awards Bolstering Educational Excellence) and Monday Night School held its first ever "Latke Bake-Off vs. Beth Shalom". In January we kicked off the school's celebration of the Temple's 60th Anniversary with Intergenerational Day at Religious School featuring the "Jewish Heirlooms Roadshow" and Tikkun projects, 75 grandparents attended. We also held the first ever Teen Summit/Night of the Arts. In March, our PTO Purim Carnival, under the direction of Russell Wise and David Newman was better than ever with new games and prizes. In April we kicked off the Jewish Community Garden at Temple Emanu-El with a lovely Earth Day program in which our Religious School composted 18 garden beds. We also took the whole Religious School and about fifty parents and grandparents to the Detroit Institute of Arts for our own unique program "What's Jewish at the DIA". We wrapped up the year with our annual Parent/Teacher Appreciation Brunch. This sample doesn't even include the many, many individual classroom highlights and individual student achievements, of which we are most proud! Great job students, we miss you and hope you are having an enjoyable summer. We can't wait to see how much you've grown in the fall!

Our Program for Organizational Development (POD) Committee, consisting of professional staff, consultants, lay leadership, parent volunteers, a teacher representative and other concerned members, launched an initiative to better our school in every facet.

## Program For Organizational Development: Religious School Improvement Effort Highlights

The purpose of the Congregational School initiative's Program for Organizational Development is to enable the congregation to re-examine its education program, looking at the big picture and ask such questions as: what should the school be teaching in the 21st century? Is our current model working? Is our instruction reaching our students? What additional help might our teachers need to be successful? It seeks to bring about a systematic process that promotes school improvement in all areas that has a significant impact upon student learning.

The POD's accomplishments this year include the development of a new Mission Statement:

**"Education at Temple Emanu-El empowers adults and children to live Jewishly through their own creativity and expression through a Reform based teaching of Judaism. Through a diverse open environment we prepare the next generation of Reform Jews."**

Also we generated a list of educational top priorities:

- Create family education plans aligned with the curriculum.
- Experiential learning opportunities.
- Teachers expand range of instructional tools with the emphasis on technology.
- Improve communication with stakeholders.

Some of what we want to accomplish as we enter our second year:

- Establish a subcommittee for family engagement. This committee should include a facilitator, teacher, student and 2 more interested parties.
- Establish a subcommittee for curriculum.
- Provide Monday Night School options (Temple Teen Connection).

Finally: the POD could use your insight! Whether you are a Religious School parent, educational professional or just a concerned member, be part of real, organized, meaningful change that will improve the experience of our students and their families now and in the future.

This summer we will be arranging a tour with the organization Feet on the Street. We hope to visit different venues in Detroit to learn about the broader topic of Food Justice. We hope this will help guide us to our next projects.

## Reminder and Options for Payment of Financial Obligations

The deadline for return of dues commitment forms for the year that begins July 1, 2012 is June 4. If you have not yet returned your forms, please do so promptly.

We are always happy to have any opportunity to thank our members for making prompt payment on financial obligations. Obviously, this is what keeps us running and we are most grateful. We are also always trying to find ways to make payment easier for you, and, if possible, less expensive for Temple.

**Credit/Debit Cards:** We currently have over 100 members who regularly charge their obligations with Visa, MasterCard or American Express on a monthly or quarterly basis. While this is great in terms of cash flow (because the money is generally deposited within 72 hours of the transaction), every credit/debit card transaction does cost Temple several dollars in fees and we gratefully thank those of you who are voluntarily giving a little extra to help us offer this service.

**Direct Debit:** Credit cards are a safe and convenient payment method, but there are other methods equally convenient and safe that would save us the cost of fees. We now have the option of direct debit, where money can be wired from a member's bank account into Temple's. (Please check with your financial institution regarding any fees your account may incur for this service.)

**Automatic Check Writing Services:** Instead of traditional check writing, many members are now using a check writing service to pay regular Temple obligations, which saves the checkwriter the hassle of writing the check and the cost of postage, and is generally a free service to them as well as to Temple.
