When the caller stands beside the shofar blower on Rosh Hashana and in a low voice calls out the notes the blower is to sound, [we] hear the human voice say "Tekiah/Alarm!" and then the reply of shofar blast as the eerie voice of God. Coming not from a man-made silver trumpet, but from the unplanned twists and turns of an animal horn. Sounding not

a tuneful melody, but the unmusical outburst of alarm and grief from Heaven. If we cry out, the Holy One will answer, but the answer is a crying-out toward us. [Arthur Waskow, Seasons of our Joy]

For many of us, the highlight of the Holidays is the blowing of the shofar on Rosh Hashana morning. Its loud, jarring, primal call seems to pierce the air above us in the sanctuary. So out of place among the sweet and melodious music of the choir, cantor and keyboard, it calls to us from beyond the liturgy of the prayerbook, from a time before we wrote the words of our worship. It is an echo from our more primitive past, a reminder of our people that journeyed through the desert and into the hills of Judea to begin the history that has brought us into this moment in our sanctuary.

On S'lichot evening we will discuss the history and the structure of the three-part Shofar Service that all but concludes our Rosh Hashana morning service. Its arrangement and organization was carefully crafted in rabbinic times to proclaim a singular spiritual message. We'll explore that history and see how our modern machzor (Holiday prayerbook), our *Gates of Repentance* reflects that traditional organization.

I invite you to join me on S'lichot Saturday for this 7:30 pm presentation/discussion bringing your copies of "Gates of Red". Following that program we will gather in the Sanctuary for Havdalah and S'lichot worship at 9:00 pm. Of course, everyone is invited to the 6:30 pm pot-luck dinner (please RSVP to the office) prior to the program. It will be a full evening as we combine social conversation, study and worship. And with S'lichot (which means "forgivenesses") we will begin, once again, our Holiday season.

The words "Kol HaLimud" literally mean: "The voice of learning". What they represent at Temple is a serious effort to improve our Religious School/education programs, and truly achieve educational excellence at all levels for our students and their families. This process has already brought important improvements, including more arts and culture, family education, and some key technological upgrades. In the year ahead we will see even more focus in these areas, with new resources and experiences aimed at helping us to better connect, learn and celebrate our community and Judaism. "Kol HaLimud" takes shape from what was formally called the Program for Organizational Development or "P.O.D., which also functioned as the Education Committee. In other words, "Kol HaLimud" is a results-oriented oriented group consisting of lay leaders, including chair Ruth Hurwitz, and Education V.P. Wendy Bakst, Education Director Geoff Berdy, assistant Vivian DeGain, teacher representative Lynn Cooper, and inspired and dedicated members including Michelle Keys, Staci Hirsch, Robin Gold, Shari Bills and Fred Frank. Professional Jewish educational consultants in the areas of curriculum and professional development assist, including Rabbi Rob Morais, formerly Education Director at Temple Israel and currently director of Shalom Street (the Jewish children's museum). "Kol HaLimud" is the lynch-pin of a three year process made possible by the generosity of the Hermelin-Davidson Center for Congregational Excellence, as administered by the Alliance for Jewish Education (a division of the Federation of Metropolitan Detroit). I am writing this still in the midst of a long, hot summer—but, as fall inevitably approaches, I would like to note that with it will come a great opportunity—the opportunity to search for and hire a new rabbi. As I think most are aware, Rabbi Klein is in his final year as senior rabbi and will become Rabbi Emeritus at July 1, 2013. This means that we will be engaging in a search, beginning early this fall, for a new senior rabbi. I am very pleased to announce that Trustees Lynn Cooper and Russell Wise have agreed to cochair the rabbinical search committee, and, in turn, they will be involved in putting together a diverse, representative committee. I am very optimistic that

our search will be a great success. I know that members tend to have strong feelings about what qualities our rabbi should have. Please do not sit on those feelings—I would be most grateful if you wish to share them—just email or write or call. I expect we will have a more organized process for soliciting your ideas when the committee is fully constituted, but in the meantime, I would welcome your thoughts. I would also like to note with great anticipation that we will be planning a very special recognition event for Rabbi Klein to celebrate and thank him for his many outstanding years of dedicated service to our congregation.

This brings us to the cantor search. Originally, lay leadership thought we should search for a cantor this year as well as a rabbi. However, lay leadership is now persuaded otherwise, and we will postpone that search for another year. The rationale? One, any potential new rabbi likely would expect to be part of this process. Two, any potential new cantor likely would like to know who the rabbi is. Also, after the new rabbi is identified, we will have a better handle on available clergy budget. All makes sense, and that is the direction we will take. Since the music program this year, with Kelly Onickel as our full-time cantorial soloist, Lauren Gross as visiting cantorial soloist for the High Holidays, George Jonte leading the adult choir, is in fine shape, we feel we will do just fine with our Temple music program even for a further year. Also, with Cantor Sharlein having left, her role of the B'nai Mitzvah tutoring is being ably carried out by our Education Director, Geoff Berdy.

I'm sure you have noticed the construction in progress in front of our property. Yeshiva Beth Yahuda Foundation has leased the Federation-owned parcel along Ten Mile Road in order to construct a girls high school building. That is the kind of use that was anticipated when the land sale to Federation occurred some years ago. The building itself will be situated at the corner of Church and Ten Mile, with landscaping and parking areas surrounding. We have reached an agreement (though the written easement document is still being negotiated) to allow the school to use our driveway from Ten Mile Road to enter (not exit, and no construction traffic) their property (they will loop to exit at Church). They will pay for widening and repaying—as a key element, by taking this approach, they will leave the east row of the trees that parallel our drive. I know that the site construction going on at the moment is not pretty,—but it seems to be moving quickly. Thanks to John Jacobs and David Hart for helping with review of the project issues and the negotiations. Incidentally, if you encounter any material problems related to the construction activities, please inform Executive Director Susan Kirschner so she can coordinate any needed intervention.

Once again, the start of school is here. This annual "rite of passage" is not only a special time for children but a time of celebration for parents. The school year begins on Wednesday, September 5th, with orientation on Tuesday morning, September 4th, from 9:00 A.M. to 10:00 A.M. If you have not yet enrolled for fall please do so as soon as possible to accommodate the schedule of your choice. Some days have limited availability. Our infant program continues its year round

schedule. Please call the Early Childhood office for information on any of our programs.

Please join Rabbi Klein and me for a "meet and greet" on Friday, September 7th, at 8:45 A.M. Drop your child off in his/her classroom, stop by Katzman Hall and enjoy a bagel and cup of coffee.

Though many things have changed, many still remain the same. Our dedicated staff will continue to offer children a positive, loving, nurturing environment where every child is recognized as an individual.

The first day of school is often a concern for children, even if they are returning to a familiar environment. Be sure to acknowledge your child's fears and anxiety when you drop him/her off. Explain that you will be back to pick up following a certain activity, such as after lunch or after nap. This is easier for children to understand rather than giving them a time of day.

It is unfortunate that often times we find the problem of bullying within our schools. Pre-schoolers complaints of being picked on are sometimes dismissed by parents with the response of "just ignore it." According to Parent & Child magazine, findings suggest we really should listen more carefully. They showed that 1 in 10 children between the ages of four and six have been bullied. Preschool bullying often includes kicking, fighting, punching and shoving. By the age of three, we need to start teaching our children how to respond to bullying so that they will not be a victim. Teach children to use phrases like "I'm mad," or "I'm sad." Encourage assertiveness in your children; don't speak for them. Also teach them to look their friends in the eye when they speak. We want all of our children to feel secure and confident.

With the fall holidays coming, our classes will be busy preparing for Rosh Hashanah, the birthday of the world. Apples dipped in honey will ensure a sweet new year. This year you may want to add a pomegranate to your celebration as it is symbolic of "plenty." The countless seeds in the pomegranate represent the endless wishes for health and happiness in the New Year.

As our Hebrew calendar begins the year 5773, we wish all of you a sweet and joyous New Year with peace to all. L'Shana Tova.


