Presuming that come the Holidays, the Tigers would be the favorite to take the Pennant (not so sure now), I was thinking about a HH sermon called "Life Lessons We Learn from Baseball". I may postpone that message until Spring Training. Still, here are a few of the lessons I've been thinking about:

Judge slowly

In baseball a player can't be judged in anything less than a month. Sometimes

it takes a whole season. We should not be too quick to judge co-workers or neighbors, or even politicians on first, second or even third impressions.

Pay attention to the everyday mundane

Baseball is a game of consistency, of doing the expected things regularly and well. While the spectacular defensive play or the clutch hit is most often remembered and highlighted on the nightly news, what is most important to the team is that players field their positions consistently and batters reach base regularly. So too in our daily lives we so often take for granted the really important things: the regularly consistent pleasantries and quiet joys of family and friends, of being part of the community, of being out in Nature.

Stay ahead of the action

Good ballplayers, whether pitchers, batters or fielders are always thinking one play ahead. It's not that the game moves slowly, it's that every play is a prelude to what comes next. After each pitch, everyone on the field (and in the dugout) is evaluating what just happened in order to be ready for what is about to happen, even if it's the unexpected. Every moment, every single moment of our lives is a prelude to what follows. What I do now will surely effect what happens to me next. Pay attention to each moment, don't let it slip away without considering its consequences.

You don't have to be perfect

A player who gets a hit only one time in three is regarded as exceptional. A pitcher who allows even two runs scored against him per game is unusually talented. Even if a team does most everything right every day, it will still lose 40% of its games-but the team will also end up in the World Series. We don't have to live perfect lives to be exceptional and successful people. We just have to be steady, and focused, and diligent in the things we do every day.

Now let's get ready for the "Fall Classic".

Upon learning of the death of Bea Sacks, our friends in Brovary gathered together and conducted a special ceremony in memory of Bea. Using a candlestick we sent them years ago with a picture of Bea as well as other Social Action Committee members, they expressed a message of sadness and gratitude to Bea for bringing Brovary to Temple Emanu-El.

The members of the Bea Sacks Social Action Committee thank you for your strong commitment to Tikkun Olam and send prayers of peace to you and your families in the New Year.

I am feeling very moved by the dedication of our members. The strong communal connections members can make here make it easier to get through troubled times and be more resilient.

Annual membership commitment income remains the primary source of operating funds and, as of this writing 68 members had increased their pledges over last year as we embark on the journey that will take us "until 120".

This year we reviewed our dues policy and concluded that it remains appropriate for us. Some of our families face particularly extreme financial challenges, and your generosity allows us to respond in a spirit of tzedakah and chesed (righteousness and loving kindness). For "all the people of Israel are responsible for one another" (BT, Shavuout 39a). Discussion as we reviewed our policy led to a deeper understanding of what membership offers: year-round worship, education for all ages and social events whenever and as

Camp Run About campers have been enjoying fun in the sun with water play, creative movement, picnic lunches, Bubbles the Clown, and Mad Science with their Dinosaur Program, just to highlight some of our activities. New this year Metroparks brought a nature center to our school in their Mobile Learning Center. The theme was "We're Fond of Ponds." Campers will enjoy a field trip to Heritage Park which will include a morning of fun under their sprinklers.

Our Safety Town program under the direction of head teacher Janet Sigmon was held during Session II for Camp Get-A-

Way campers. A field trip to the Health Exploration Station with a presentation of "Stranger Danger" was part of our summer program. A visit from Louie the Lightening Bug as well as swimming at the JCC pool filled our days. Everyone enjoyed our camp Shabbat sing-along with Rabbi Klein and me. Graduation was held on July 26th and everyone passed with flying colors (red, amber and green).

Summer is going all too quickly as we get ready for Session III of Day Camp. A trip to Red Oaks Water Park, "Jungle Book" at the Marquis Theater, as well as a special performance from Paula Doak highlight this session.

According to a recent study in the Pediatrics Journal, preschoolers are not spending enough time playing outdoors and just being kids. Daily physical activity is essential for preschool age children both for preventing obesity and for their development – their physical development and their cognitive development. When kids are running, skipping and learning to ride tricycles, they are not only exercising their bodies, they are also exercising their minds, which is why playtime is so important.

Tania Cowling published the following in the Bright Hub entitled "The Many Things Preschoolers Learn Through Play:"

Through play children grow in so many ways. They learn how to use their muscles, coordinate what they see with what they do, and gain mastery over their bodies. They observe their world and decide what they like. Children acquire new skills and learn when and how to use them. The act of play teaches creativity as children do not completely differentiate reality from fantasy. Pretend play and real play tickles the senses of young children and allows them to explore and think.

Young children must "play" to learn cognitive skills and actual facts. Unlike adults, who learn by reading or being lectured to, children need to learn thinking skills and information by experimenting and just "doing it."

Children go through stages of play; solitary, parallel, and cooperative play. The solitary, independent player engages in activities on her own and not with other children. In parallel play, the child is playing independently but next to other peers, perhaps using the same materials. Finally, children move to cooperative play which is group play with everyone organizing and taking on different roles. Through play, children learn to become social and to cooperate with one another.

Fall orientation will be Tuesday, September 4th with school beginning on Wednesday, September 5th, including extended care. If you have not yet enrolled for fall please do so as soon as possible to accommodate the schedule of your choice.

Our infant program is open year round and will remain open the last week in August to meet the needs of our working families. Please call the Nursery office for information on all of our programs. We look forward to welcoming many of our infants into our Toddler Room at the Temple.


